

The Lincoln County Board of Commissioner Public Works Committee met in a work session on Thursday, October 29, 2009, at 6:00 p.m. in the commissioners' conference room. Those present were Chairman H. Wade Johnson; Commissioner Larry Collins, District Two; Commissioner Darrell Henderson, District Three; Mr. Roby Seymour, Public Works Director; and Mrs. Roxanne B. Ashmore, County Clerk.

1.

Call Meeting to Order

Commissioner Henderson, Chairman of the Public Works Committee, called the meeting to order.

2.

Invocation

Commissioner Collins opened the meeting with prayer.

3.

Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag followed the invocation.

4.

Public Roads

Director Seymour informed the committee that there are approximately fifteen public dirt roads in the county. He said that all have a dedicated right of way, but they are not in the county road registry, but do serve the general public. He said that all of the roads meet the criteria and that the majority of the roads have been worked by the county on more than one occasion in the past.

Chairman Johnson said that it is about six miles of public dirt roads.

The committee discussed a possible ordinance change that would allow the board of commissioners by resolution to accept the public dirt roads in the county road registry.

Following some further discussion, the committee agreed to put this item on the November agenda for discussion by the full board.

5.

Road Striping

Director Seymour said that the list contains 49 primary roads totaling 99.25 miles. The costs of doing the yellow and white lines will be \$131,010 and the cost of doing only the center yellow lines will be \$65,505. He said that this can be paid from SPLOST funds.

The committee agreed to recommend to the full board to do the yellow center lines on all roads at a cost of \$65,505.

6.

Roads in Phase C Providence Ferry Subdivision

Director Seymour said he had received a request from Mr. Roy Jeffcoat to accept the roads in Phase C of Providence Ferry Subdivision into the county road registry. He said that the one year warranty period had expired and that the roads meet all of the requirements. He also said that the roads in Phases A and B had already been accepted in the county road registry.

Following some discussion, the committee agreed to table this item.
